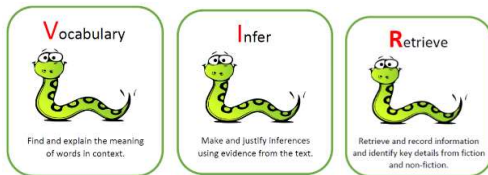

Spelling and Reading



We have spelling lessons each Tuesday and Thursday. Children will be given new spellings each week to be practised at home. They will be tested each Friday.

The adults in our class love to read, we hope you do too. This year we will continue to use Reading Vipers to help us with our guided reading. These can be used at home when reading too. In our guided reading lessons this term we will be focusing on the vocabulary, infer and retrieve vipers.



Writing



We will be writing an information text all about the world-famous graffiti artist...Banksy. We will also be using our descriptive skills from term 1 to write a setting description and using our ability to think from a character's point of view to write a diary entry from our new main character's perspective.

Maths

In maths this term we will look at the four operations: addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. Pupils should continue to secure their knowledge of the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication and division tables, whilst learning the 3, 4 and 8s which we aim to know fluently by the end of year 3.



Science



Our science topic is 'Can you see me?', during which we will work scientifically to find out all about the following statements: Recognise that we need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light, notice that light is reflected from surfaces, recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid (opaque) object, find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change and finally, recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes.

Computing

Our computing unit for autumn 2 is 'branching databases'. We will learn how to: Sort objects 'yes' or 'no' questions, how to complete a branching database using 2Question and how to create a database of the children's choice.



Art & Design

We will be learning about the art of drawing by understanding how to use simple shapes to draw objects and developing observation skills to draw natural and manmade objects.



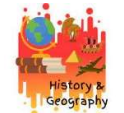
MFL

During this half term the children will revisit colours with an Autumn and Bonfire Night theme. They will go on to learn the days of the week and months of the year.



Geography

We will be exploring the following enquiry questions in geography this term:
How would we describe Corby as a settlement and why?
How is where I live unique?
Why do people migrate?
We will also carry out mapwork around our local area.



History

We will be exploring the following enquiry questions in history this term:
How has the fact that iron was found near Corby shaped it as a community?
Remembering the Pole Fair. What is the Pole Fair and why is it a significant event in Corby?

Music

Our unit this term is Glockenspiel Stage 1. This unit introduces children to learning about the language of music through playing the glockenspiel. The learning is focussed around exploring and developing playing skills through the glockenspiel.
